**POLICY REGARDING
NON-DISTRICT LICENSED CHIROPRACTORS
PARTICIPATING IN A CLINIC/EVENT IN THE DISTRICT**

Pursuant to the Health Occupations Revision Act of 2009 §3-1205.02(a)(3), a chiropractor licensed in another state may come to the District for a limited period of time to “visit, examine, treat or advise a specific patient or client in the District, or to give a demonstration of a procedure or clinic in the District provided that the individual engages in the provision of care, consultation, demonstration, or clinic in “affiliation with” a comparable health professional licensed...pursuant to this chapter.”

The Board of Chiropractic’s formulated policy for non-District licensed chiropractors participating in a clinic/event in the District will be as follows:

REQUIREMENTS

- All Applicants:
- (1) The visiting chiropractor must be in good standing in each state licensed and possess an unencumbered license in each state licensed.
 - (2) Unless otherwise determined by the Board, the visiting chiropractor must request permission from the Board of Chiropractic at least sixty (60) days prior to the start of practice in the District.
 - (3) The visiting chiropractor’s request must contain:
 - (a) the purpose of the practice visit and whether or not it is for voluntary services or for fee;
 - (b) the anticipated duration of the visit;
 - (c) the chiropractic license numbers in each state licensed; and
 - (d) an affidavit that he/she is in good standing in each jurisdiction licensed and that during the visit

they will be affiliated with a named chiropractor who is locally licensed.

(4) The visiting chiropractor's request must be accompanied by a notarized statement from the District licensed chiropractor that he/she consents to being "affiliated with" the visiting chiropractor for the duration of the visit.

(5) Unless otherwise determined by the Board, the visiting non-District licensed chiropractor may practice chiropractic no more than fourteen (14) days during any calendar year.


(6) Unless otherwise determined by the Board, the locally licensed chiropractor, with whom the visiting chiropractor is affiliated, must be onsite when the visiting chiropractor is practicing chiropractic in the District.

(7) No District licensed chiropractor shall be in "affiliation with" more than five chiropractors at any one time. The number of visiting chiropractors with whom a District licensed chiropractor may affiliate may be determined by the Board on a case-by-case basis.

This policy shall be effective immediately.
