LETTER FROM PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF STATE BUREAU OF PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS

Board Action:

To review the letter from the Pennsylvania Department of State Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs dated March 28, 2017.

Background:

On March 28, 2017, the Pennsylvania Department of State Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs sent a letter to Dr. Rachel Levina, MD, with the Pennsylvania Office of the Physician General regarding inclusion of the Pennsylvania State Board of Chiropractic in future discussions on safe prescribing guidelines of opioids in orthopedic and sports medicine. This letter was subsequently distributed to various interested parties for review and discussion.

This information is being provided to the Board for review of what steps are being taken in other jurisdictions to include chiropractic services in the greater healthcare field, especially in the topic of opioids and pain relief.
