In addition the Board requested additional information on the PEP update from ASPPB. It should be noted that this Board does not require this examination and the change will not affect the DC Board.

OS-0112-05	<p><u>Compact for State Boards of Psychology:</u></p> <p><u>Update:</u> Pending departmental decision/position regarding entering into a jurisdictional agreement, which is a legislative function.</p> <p><u>Background:</u> The Psychology Interjurisdictional Compact is an interstate compact designed to facilitate practice of psychology across jurisdictional boundaries developed by ASPPB. The ASPPB is encouraging member boards to join the compact to assist licensees with cross jurisdictional practice and consumers with additional access to practitioners.</p>
