Disciplinary Actions approved during February 1, 2017 executive session.

Courtney Bennett, RN (Respondent's status is active)	Respondent, RN, worked as a subcontractor with DCLTC conducting in home or nursing home, "face-to-face assessments, to determine if the patient meets the criteria to continue receiving Community/Home Based LTC services." The RN submitted documentation misrepresenting that she had done an in-person assessment and met with the patient to determine her continued need for ADHP services and obtain her preferred choice attestation. However, RN only spoke with patient on the phone and never interviewed her in-person. RN was terminated.	MOTION: NSA completion of course, "Professional Accountability & Legal Liability for Nurses" and 1,000 word essay reflecting on RN's failure to perform in-person assessment of the patient/client.  VOTE: Approved
	Fraudulent timesheet; patient abandonment. Respondent, HHA, terminated after client called Alliance Home Health Care on 7/12/16 to report that HHA had not come to work for days. But, HHA falsely told Alliance that she had been working every day and fraudulently submitted time log and timesheets for three days, not worked, 7/8 through 7/10. Timesheet also contained description of client's condition, nutrition, and activities days not worked.	MOTION: NSA \$250 fine.  VOTE: Approved
Amanda Turner, HHA (Respondent's status is active)	Respondent, HHA, falsely submitted timesheets for four days, 12/7 – 12/10/16 while the client was admitted to and was a patient at WHS. 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Vanetta Anderson, LPN (Respondent's status is active)	Allegation of abuse which was substantiated against Respondent, LPN, who was terminated. (A police report was also generated.) LPN allegedly punched patient in the face, causing a bruise above her left eye. Report submitted by DDS, however, reveals conflicting accounts of what happened; how injury happened; and why it was not noted by LPN. Respondent provided a response to the OTA.	MOTION: Letter of Concern VOTE: Approved
Herve Tchakounte, HHA (Respondent's status is active)	Falsification of timesheets. Respondent falsely submitted timesheets for work done when the patient was in the hospital. We have timesheets signed by both HHA and the patient and have the hospital records for patient's hospital stay.	MOTION: NSA \$250 fine.  VOTE: Approved
