<p>OS-14-025</p>	<p><u>BOARD/DEPARTMENT’S REPORT</u> In this segment, discussion can be held on issues and/or activities pertaining to the activities of the Board/Department. Presenters may be members of the Board, staff, or public.</p> <p>Dr. Bazely reported that she attended the regional District III and IV meeting this month in Florida and felt that a “power poll” should have been done prior to attending the conference in order to maximize the experience. She stated that this would have ensured that the attendees would have been more knowledgeable of the statutes and regulations prior to joining the smaller discussion groups. She reported that a little more work could have been done prior to forming the groups. She stated that she thought the PACE program was good one and that the Board should look further into regulating Chiropractic Assistants in order to further protect the public.</p> <p>A. <u>BOARD CHAIR’S REPORT</u></p> <p>Dr. Vanterpool reported that she also attended the FCLB regional district meeting. She felt that a lot was left on the table during the small group discussions, and in general, the conference could have been structured a lot better. 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reformed to ensure that actions are finalized instead of continuous discussion of the same topics.

B. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

FY2014 BOC Calendar – Next Meeting:

- November 4th or 18th, 2014 – TBD, November 11, 2014 (Veterans Day)
 - FCLB Regional Conference- September 4-7, 2014 Palm Beach
- 1) Dr. Watson also attended the regional FCLB conference and stated that she recommends that the Board consider regulating Chiropractic Assistants. She stated the Board should take a look at the exam that the FCLB has in place for certification of these professionals. FCLB indicated that the Exam cost \$150.00 and is offered through the FCLB.
 - 2) She stated that another topic concerning the Certified Chiropractic Assistant was if the CCA has already been practicing and decides to practice in another state, will they be required to take the Exam required by the FCLB now? She recommended that the Board should take a look at those types of issues when deciding on regulation pertaining to Certified Chiropractic Assistants.
 - 3) Dr. Watson also discussed the Passport Mobility Program and recommended the Board consider this as a vehicle to allow international Chiropractors to practice temporarily in your state. As the language is developed from the FCLB, the Board should possibly start the discussion about the regulations pertaining to the Passport Mobility Program. Dr. Watson reminded the Board that the International task force is to be established in FY 2015 in the District to assist with regulations pertaining to this topic.
 - 4) Dr. Watson believed that the new law in Nova Scotia,



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which requires all healthcare professionals to meet quarterly to agree on issues such as scope of practice, investigations, and discipline is very interesting. She recommended keeping track of how it progresses in light of the implementation of the Affordable Care Act and the likelihood that more providers in the US will be working on a team-based model.

- 5) She stated that she enjoyed the presentation on EBAS (Ethics and Boundaries). She stated that the exercise on how to grade the ethics exams was excellent.
- 6) She stated that FCLB has a new Executive Director and hopes that the new leadership will focus on updating regulation (namely the Model Practice Act) and recognize that the FCLB's role is to support its members (ie. Regulatory Boards). Dr. Watson mentioned that the topic of the Affordable Care Act and how it may impact the Chiropractic profession was not discussed at all. Also there was no discussion about the Chiropractic workforce. Overall, Dr. Watson thought the conference was good and the smaller group discussions can be made more productive. She stated that Dr. Sportelli's presentation at the past meeting was informative and should be used as an example of what topics need to be discussed in future conferences.
