

Assisted Living Residence Program Operational Definition

An Assisted Living Residence or ALR means any entity, whether public or private, for profit or not for profit that combines housing, health, and personalized assistance, in accordance to individually developed service plans, for the support of individuals who are not related to the owner or operator of the entity.

An Assisted Living Residence or ALR does not include a group home for mentally retarded persons as defined in section 2(5) of the Health-Care and Community Residence Facility, Hospice and Home Care Licensure Act of 1983 or a mental health community residence facility as that term is used in Chapter 38 of Title 22 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations.

Restrictions

The ALR licensed pursuant to this act shall not use in its title the words “hospital”, “sanitorium”, “nursing”, “convalescent”, “rehabilitative”, “subacute”, or “hospice”.
